Abandonment of Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System (OSTDS)

OSTDS abandonment permit applications must be accompanied by information and materials specified below before a site evaluation will be performed by this office. If incomplete, the package will be returned to the applicant.

The following documents are required before an application is complete:

- Application/site evaluation fee of \$100.00 is payable when application is turned in. Application form must have ALL REQUIRED information filled out before it is accepted. APPLICATION MUST CONTAIN ORIGINAL SIGNATURE. If a representative is appointed to act on your behalf, a Letter of Authorization must be submitted, or a copy of a legal contract.
- **Site plan** drawn to scale, or a survey of property with dimensions showing placement of structure, septic system, water source (well/water hookup), driveway, and ANY other buildings, swimming pools, easements, drainage features, slopes, or bodies of water on property.
- Legal description or certified deed and land parcel number. The parcel number may be obtained from your annual tax statement.
- **Flags.** One flag must be placed at the entrance to the property, one flag must be placed next to the septic tank. Flags are provided by this office.
- Upon approval, a septic tank repair permit will be issued. SEPTIC TANK **ABANDONMENT** PERMITS ARE VALID FOR THREE (3) MONTHS FROM DATE OF ISSUANCE.
